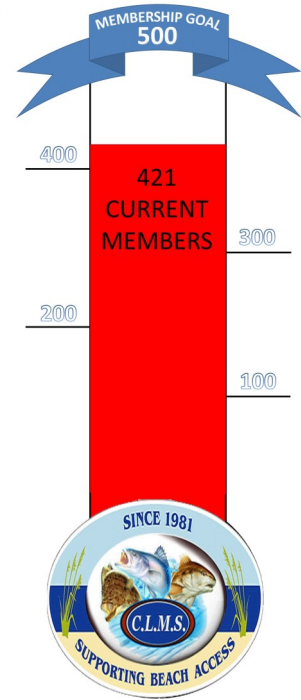

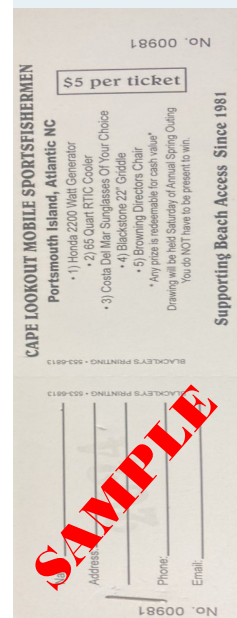
Newsletter notes

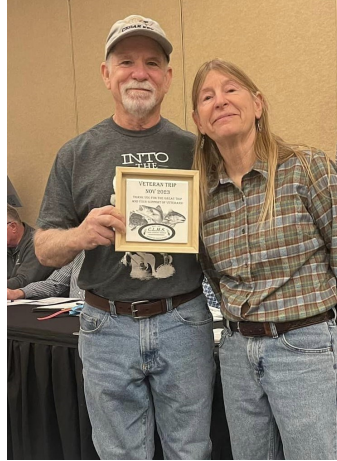

CALO Superintendent Report- Jeff West

I get questions every year about why we do not do Christmas trees or dune restoration - I know y'all do too! I have received an inordinate number of inquiries this year. The beach at Fort Macon where they do take Christmas trees for dune restoration is not the same as ours - the erosional characteristics are completely different from ours, the logistics of getting them to our beach are significantly different, our rules about introducing non-native stuff are different, we would have to get a permit from the USACE and CAMA, and (this is the big one) - it does not work on a natural barrier island!

The islands are not fixed in place like people would like to think. They have learned that the hard way at Cape Hatteras. While there is erosion, the barrier islands are not washing away. They are healthy, moving and adapting to the forces of nature. If we do not interfere, barrier islands will heal themselves even after destructive storms by shifting sand inland, slowly rebuilding foredunes, and widening the marsh along the tidal inlets and sounds. Typical storms are a great example – it's demonstrated by how the storm washes large fans of sand across the middle of the island, elevating it, a form of coastal adaptation now known as over wash. The wind redistributes sand further, often rebuilding primary dune lines. Just takes time. The issue is not the islands, but the man-made structures that we put over there.

Cape Hatteras is the perfect example – they have spent millions and millions of dollars, constructed massive artificial dunes, bulkheads, and rock revetments during the Great Depression (Works Progress Administration and Civilian Conservation Corps) and through the late 1960's to “stabilize” the islands – they were no match for storm surge and the power of waves. NPS and USACE practices gave “the false impression of safety and stability offered by the [artificial] barrier dunes,”. “As the system is stabilized to the point it seems to be safe for development, man builds roads and utilities that establish a line which soon becomes a ‘line-of-defense’ (think NC 12). Widespread private and public property development contributes directly to increased pressure to protect this line at significant cost to taxpayers. It is important to stress that the dune lines, road lines, utility lines, or property lines have no natural significance and are typically undefendable. They did not work at Cape Hatteras, and they don't at Cape Lookout. That is why I am trying to stay ahead of things by moving stuff (Longpoint Cabins) and being prepared to move stuff like the Great Island Cabins. We will either learn to live with it or lose a lot of dollars fighting it.

Nick holds a bachelor's degree in science from The Ohio State University and a master's degree in park and recreation management from Slippery Rock University.



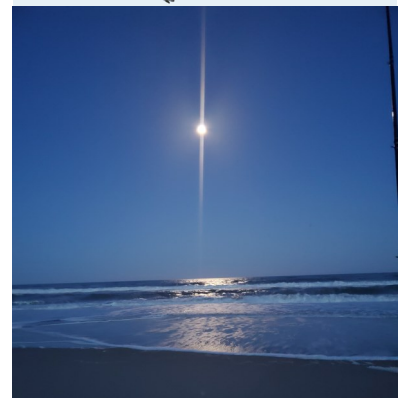
Spring Outing; Beach Clean-up April 12-14 on P.I.

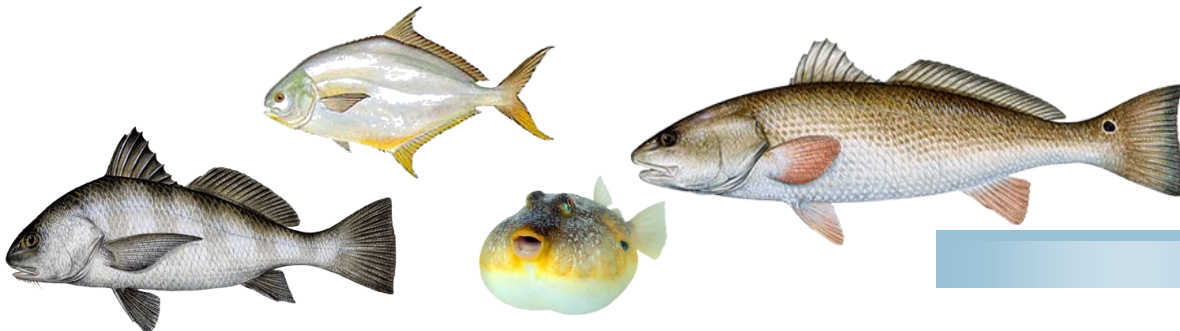
CLMS Year-Round Red Drum Tournament Rules
