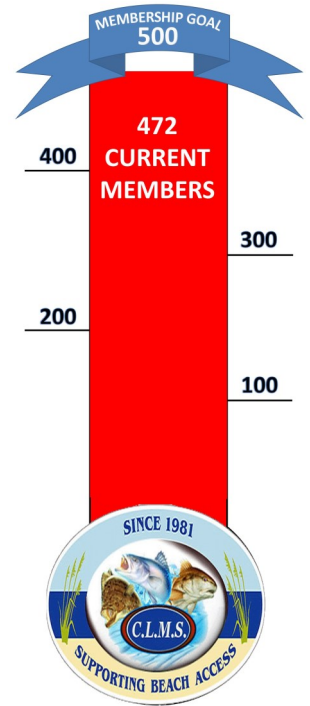

Hello. Just wanted to confirm new directions to get to ferry and new rules that MUST be followed.

- Please do not drive into the RV resort like you have in the past. Even if the gate is wide open! You will see a dirt road to the left just BEFORE the RV Park entrance. That is where you will turn in at. There is a big sign that says "Ferry Traffic Construction Entrance". (If you get to the electric gate you have gone too far). Follow the dirt road behind restaurant, there are usually cars/trucks parked there. Call the office to let us know that you have arrived. We will either tell you to drive around to the office, or wait there, depending on how close the ferry is to loading. If anyone in your group is leaving a vehicle or trailer, this is where you will park. Please be mindful as to how you park, not blocking roadway, air compressor or dumpsters. Please park in an efficient way.
- When we do tell you to come up to the office, continue on the dirt road until you reach asphalt, stay to the right, after you pass the pool on the left, turn left. Office is in same spot as last year, on the right. You will park in spaces directly across from the office door. Pull straight in to the spots. Do not back in the spots!!!

*****VERY IMPORTANT*****

If you have an early morning ferry, and you plan on coming the night before, you must stay behind restaurant. And you must be quiet. Do not drive your vehicle into the RV Park at all! Do not walk around in the park at all. The facilities by the pool are only for Park residents. These are people's private homes, so please be respectful. Thank you.

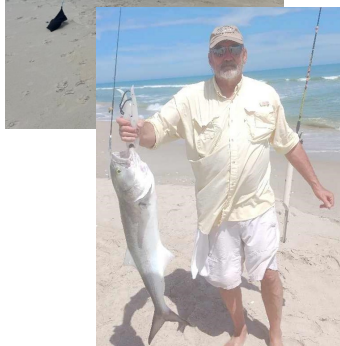
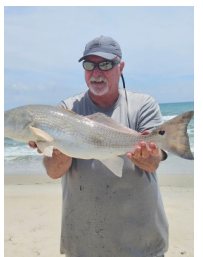
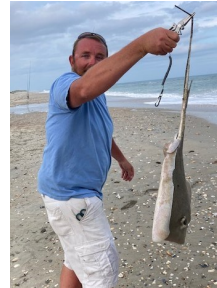
Spring Fishing Tournament highlights

Time to get involved to save our livelihood

The two new proposals that the North Carolina Department of Marine Fisheries (NCDMF) are being required that they institute will most likely add grief for our members. The bill was passed by the legislature and the Governor vetoed the whole bill. Our Legislator's overrode the veto and now the NCDMF has to figure out how to enforce the proposed law whether they like it or not. Effective date of the restrictions will be December 1, 2024.

1. The first bill is for Mandatory Harvest Reporting. The bill also requires commercial fishermen to report catches of the same species.

2. The second bill is for some more sea turtle protections that may well be a concern for our members. Officials with the state wildlife management agency are looking for input on a proposed plan to protect five species of endangered and threatened sea turtles that nest on North Carolina beaches. The North Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission is accepting comments through an online survey about the proposed sea turtle conservation plan. The deadline was May 24, 2024. The Sea Turtle information is below.

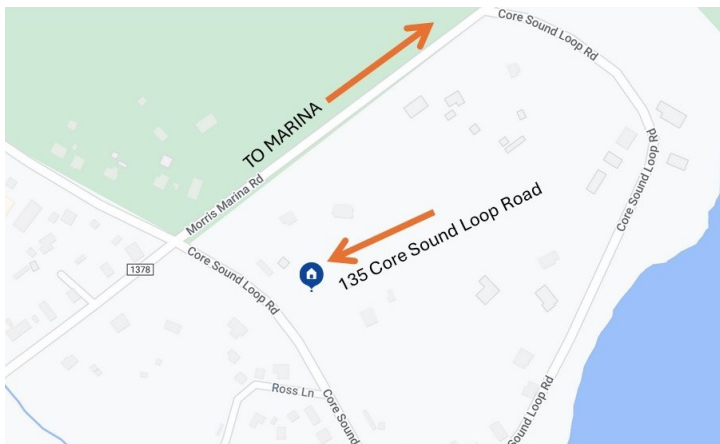

This truly shows anything can happen in an instant and that the power of prayer can do anything. I'll be heading home soon thanks to Miss Lori and few other people helping us out. BAKED SALMON

I've eaten many meals at Bill and Maria's home. She always serves a delicious meal. We met years ago when they'd shop with us at our store, Sweetgum Bottom Antiques. They would buy some treasures, then George and I would sit on the porch and talk with them until closing time.

- 2 tablespoons olive oil
 - 1 teaspoon garlic powder or minced fresh garlic
 - ¼ teaspoon salt
 - ¼ teaspoon ground black pepper
 - ¼ teaspoon chopped dill (dried or fresh)
 - 4 (6-ounce) fresh salmon fillets
1. Preheat oven to 375°. Grease a baking sheet with olive oil.
 2. In a small bowl, mix together garlic powder, salt, pepper, and dill. Rub each salmon fillet with garlic mixture. Place salmon, skin side down, on prepared pan.
 3. Bake for about 15 minutes.
