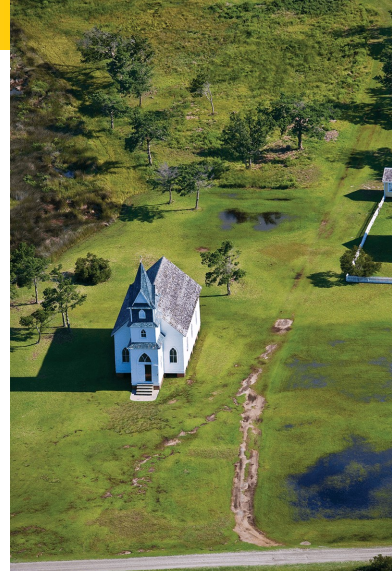

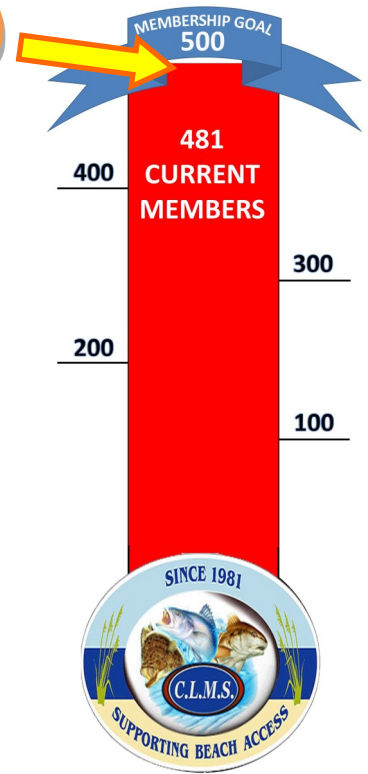

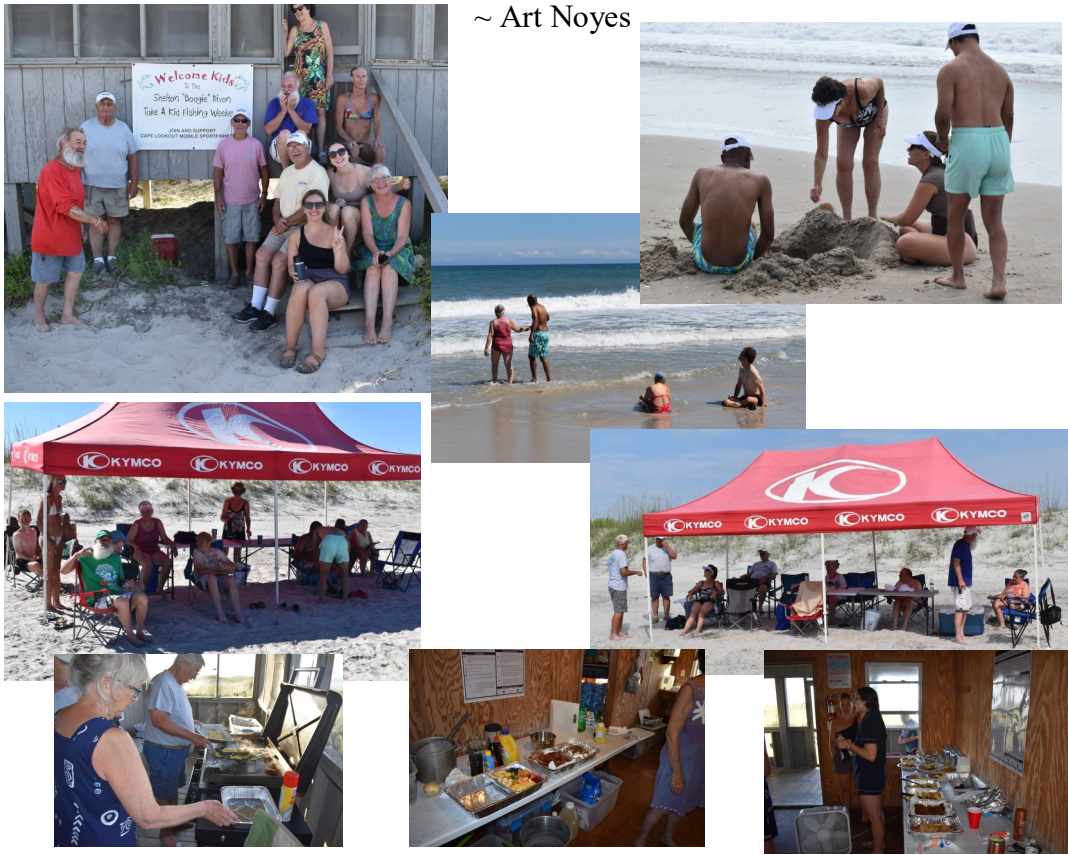
Our group prepared a spaghetti and Big Tom's famous meat balls dinner that included salad, garlic bread and dessert.

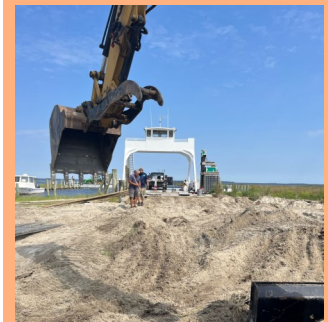

After getting set up in the cabin we served a quick lunch of hot dogs, snacks and drinks. After lunch each guest was given a rod and reel combo and it was off to the beach for some fishing. New recreational, commercial harvest reporting requirements delayed to December 1, 2025

MOREHEAD CITY – New harvest reporting requirements for recreational and commercial fisheries have been delayed by one year and will now become effective on Dec. 1, 2025.

The N.C. General Assembly recently passed [Session Law 2024-45](#), which, in part, amends [legislation from last fall](#) that would have implemented the harvest reporting requirements on Dec. 1, 2024.

This extension will allow the N.C. Department of Environmental Quality's Division of Marine Fisheries (DMF) and the N.C. Wildlife Resources Commission (WRC) to engage with stakeholders, not only to inform them about the requirements, but also to ensure that the reporting process and tool(s) are robust and user-friendly.

The legislation from last fall requires that any person who recreationally harvests Red Drum, flounder, Spotted Seatrout (speckled trout), Striped Bass and Weakfish (gray trout) must report that harvest to the DMF. This requirement applies to fish harvested from coastal fishing waters, joint fishing waters and inland fishing waters adjacent to coastal or joint fishing waters.

Additionally, the law requires anyone holding a commercial fishing license who is engaged in a commercial fishing operation to report all fish harvested to DMF, regardless of sale.

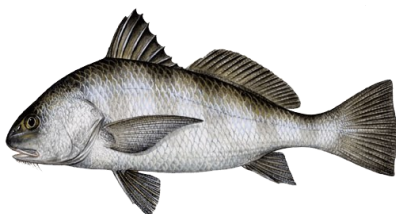
CLMS Year-Round Red Drum Tournament Rules

Fish turned in for this tournament **must be witnessed by another CLMS member**. An award for the winner shall be given at the April Beach Clean-up weekend. Your fish must be citation size (40 inches or more) and must be caught only by the angler without help from others and must be caught from the shore of Portsmouth Island.

Billy Safrit Memorial Fishing Tournament; October 11-13, 2024

****Reminder, if you paid for the Spring Fishing Tournament, your fees paid were transferred to the Fall Tournament. If you were issued a refund back in the spring, you'll need to pay the tournament fee below.****

The tournament will be held on Portsmouth Island starting a 6:00am on Friday and ending at 12:00 noon on Sunday (Weigh-in starts at 11:00am and must be in line no later than noon for your catch to be counted). Lunch will be served after the weigh-in. members aged 12-18 can fish the tournament by paying the entry fee and be eligible for the cash prizes. Youth members under 12 can fish (no fee) and receive a non-cash award. Lunch will be served after the weigh-in. The categories will be Red Drum, Black Drum, Bluefish, Sea Trout and Sea Mullet. If Flounder are made legal to catch during our tournament, they will take the place of Sea Trout. The Blue Ox side bet for the tournament will be the largest fish other than the species listed above (ensure you select and pay the \$10 entry fee on the form below). The tournament fish categories will be Red Drum, Black Drum, Bluefish, Sea Trout and Sea Mullet. If Flounder are made legal to catch during our tournament, they will take the place of Sea Trout. 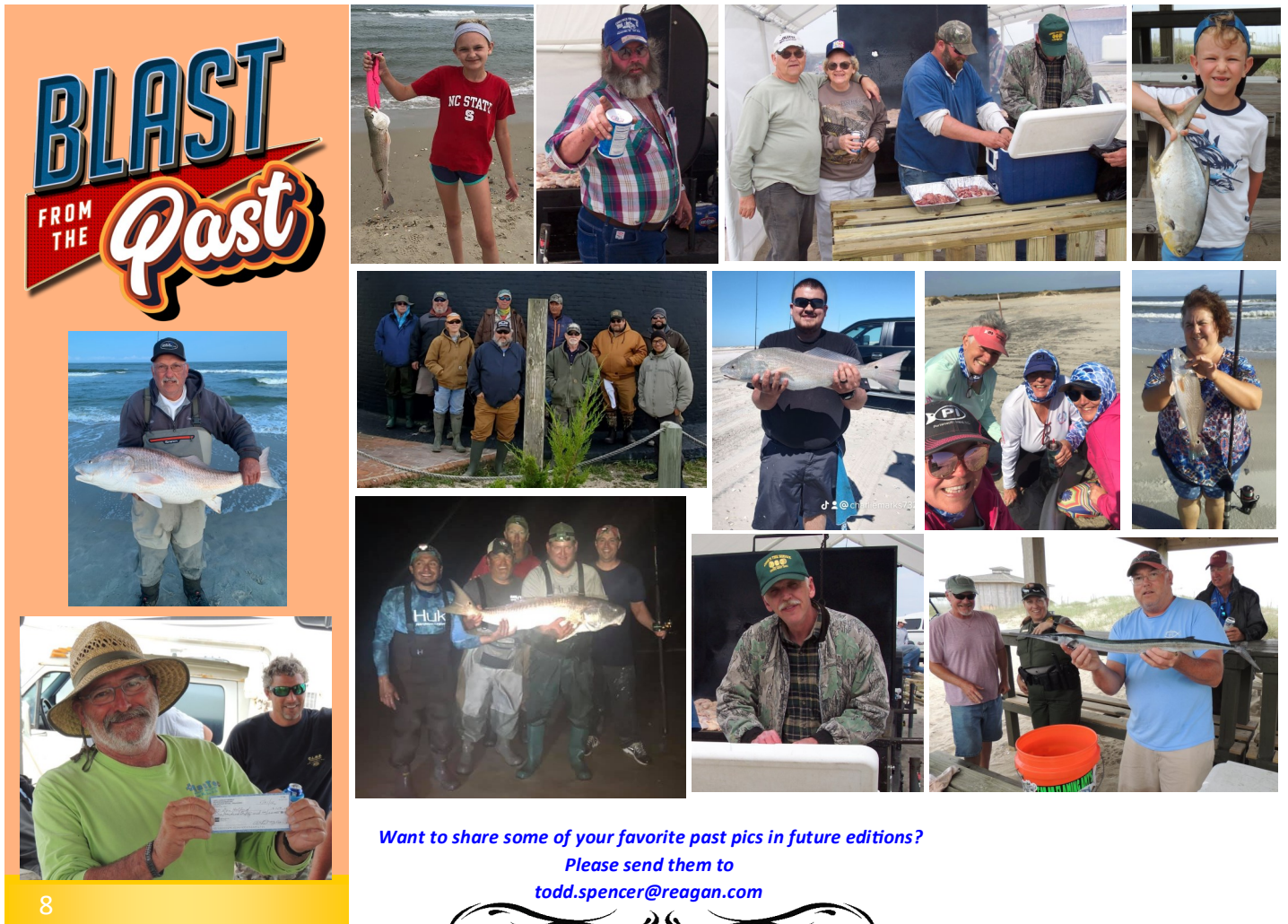

CALO Superintendent Report- Jeff West

Just wanted to provide club members with some updates from the park. Been a lot of questions about fee increases for parking, ORV permits, and cabins. There will not be any increases for parking or cabins, but I am considering what I hope everyone would think of as a modest increase for ORV permits from \$25 to \$35 for preseason, and \$50 to \$75 for permits after March 15. I'll be talking to y'all about this and getting feedback this fall. We will also be establishing prices for the new North Core Cabins – they do not have the amenities the old ones did, so they will not be as much - likely somewhere around \$95/night.

Dredging and beach nourishment in front of the Lighthouse was completed in April 2024 – we started developing this project in July of 2017. We will monitor erosion and new tidal flows and channels to determine the best way to hold the sand in place to protect the Lighthouse complex. We expect to lose about 20% of the beach in the first year unless storms give us a break. Game plan right now is to begin stabilization for the Lighthouse beach in June of 2025.

The Lighthouse rehabilitation is moving forward as of this minute. We received 6 bids and after some back and forth with the contractors and some funding work, we hope to have an award by the end of September (this project started in September 2017).

On June 6, 2024, we had the preconstruction meeting for 2018 H. Florence projects that include Codd's Creek dock, Soundside Pier (Harkers Island), and the Harkers Island harbor repairs. They started work at Codd's Creek on June 24 and completed it on July 31, 2024. Soundside pier is under construction now (August 24) and expected to be completed on September 13, 2024. The harbor repair has also begun and is expected to be completed by mid-October 2024.

I have answered dozens of inquiries about the cabins on North Core Banks, both Congressional and public. I always get a kick out of the Congressional inquiries since Congress funds the Disaster supplements - they decide when these projects get funded. Well, as I told y'all, we were finally funded, and got the contract awarded. On June 10, 2024, we had the preconstruction meeting for the North Core Banks cabins - (another 2018 H. Florence project) with Ritz Construction. They are working on design now - Geo technical sampling and survey are complete. Official schedule for NCB Cabins: Final Design submission October 6, 2024; Construction start December 19, 2024; NPS Inspection April 23, 2025; Final Completion May 19, 2025. They have about three weeks of flex built into the schedule - those dates are all worst-case scenario dates. We will monitor the construction progress and plan on bringing staff on by the first of May for systems training, set up and cleaning, and getting everything into Rec.gov needed to rent them. We will shoot for opening by June 1, 2025, assuming everything goes according to schedule.

Backroad work and the parking lot area on NCB were completed before the season and have been updated periodically to put in T&E species bypasses where the backroad no longer exists and smooth things out - sand blows 24/7. Everyone will be happy to know we are getting a newer tractor at North Core - the 2013 tractor went to the rust cemetery this summer. We replaced the well at Longpoint over the winter, and the bathhouse seems to be working well so far. We have a new wind generator that will be installed but with the new well, extra battery bank, and extra solar panels it has not been an issue yet. Lot of birds nesting this year, and we will do our best to keep backroads and beaches available for ORV use. Turtle hatchings are underway. If the numbers keep up, we will have some impacts but are doing our best to provide access for y'all and still protect the T&E birds and turtles.
